# I. ROLL CALL

#### II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A. Chair Salaveria announced that the first item on the agenda is the approval of the minutes of the March 10, 2017 regular meeting. Vice Chair Mikulina moved, and Member Young seconded the motion to approve the March 10, 2017 minutes. There was no discussion from the members.

Chair Salaveria asked if there were comments from any members of the public. Seeing none, he called for a vote.

The motion carried unanimously, 3 to 0.

# III. REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Chair Salaveria announced that the next item on the agenda is the Report of the Executive Director and called on Gwen Yamamoto Lau to provide an update on the 2017 Legislative Session and other matters.

Yamamoto Lau welcomed and introduced two new HGIA team members, Bill Mckillop, Senior Program Officer, who has over 30 years of banking experience and a specialty in energy financing. Bill replaced Yamamoto Lau's vacated position. Valerie Kubota, Program Officer, who has almost 25 years of banking experience in consumer and branch banking. Val replaced Heather Wallenstrom's vacated position.

Yamamoto Lau provided the Board an update to HB957, which in its most current version, provides GEMS financing to the Department of Education for energy efficiency measures at 0.00% interest and HB1593, which in its most current version added dollar amounts to the battery rebate. There were discussions amongst board members regarding the Legislature's ability to determine the interest rate charged on GEMS loans.

# IV. <u>DISCUSSION AND/OR DECISION MAIKING</u>

A. Chair Salaveria announced that the final item on the agenda is the approval of the 3Q2017 Quarterly Report for the period from January 1, 2017 to March 31, 2017. Vice Chair Mikulina moved, and Member Young seconded the approval of the 3Q2017 Quarterly Report.

Chair Salaveria asked Gwen Yamamoto Lau to present the action item. Yamamoto Lau provided an update on the residential and commercial loan portfolios. Thus far \$13.9 million has been committed, of which \$2.8 million is funded.

Vice Chair Mikulina inquired on the timing of the on-bill repayment ("OBR") project. Yamamoto Lau explained that the scope is currently being finalized for the extensive programming and testing to be completed to automate the OBR mechanism. The plan is to launch the origination of OBR loans (upon PUC approval) during the Summer of 2017 with an OBR mechanism "live" date in December 2017.

Chair Salaveria asked if there were additional questions or comments from the Members. Hearing none, he asked for comments from any members of the public. Seeing none, he called for a vote.
